WHAT IS EXPECTED OF YOU AS A PROSPECTIVE CHINOOK ROTARIAN?

An initiation fee of \$100.00 on your induction to the Club, plus an annual Club fee of \$ 200.00.

Contributions to the Rotary Foundation of \$150.00 are encouraged on an annual basis, all of which leads to a Paul Harris Fellowship in your name after ten years of giving.

A minimum of 60% attendance at regular meetings. Make-up meetings are afforded at the other 12 Rotary clubs in Calgary at different times of the week, at any other Rotary Club in the world, as well as through approved volunteer and Club directed activities.

Involvement in one or more committees of your choice throughout the Rotary year which runs from July 1st to June 30th each year.

Volunteer work at our fund raising activities. Spruce Meadows parking is our biggest commitment where each member is asked to commit to 12 hours of directing parking at each of the three Show Jumping events, and at the Christmas Craft Sale.

Involvement of your family members at social events, volunteering activities, and attending regular meetings and special meetings is encouraged.

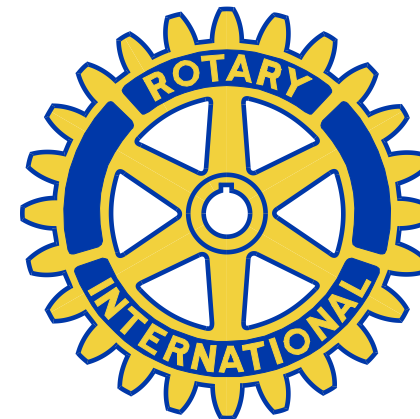
Your sponsor, who gave you this brochure, initiates the following process:

FACTS ABOUT ROTARY CHINOOK

We are over 80 members strong, representing a number of business and professional sectors of the Calgary community. Our activities represent equal parts service and fellowship.

We have set up 38 committees which operate in the areas of Club Service, International Service, Vocational Service and Community Service.

Our Club has a commitment to raise funds for local charities and for the needy in less developed countries. May to September represents our busiest time of the year for major fund raising activities.

Our fund raising includes the following:

- ▶ Spruce Meadows event parking four times a year (1st week of June, 1st week of July, 1st week of September and Xmas)
- ▶ Special events parking throughout the year on a contractual basis
- ▶ A casino every 18 months
- ▶ Lobsterfest in June

Throughout the year we are called upon to provide volunteer assistance to various charity directed activities associated with both our committee programs and charity run events.

We meet each Tuesday at 12:15 pm at the Carriage House Inn on Macleod Trail South. Evening meetings and meetings at different venues are set up 4 to 5 times a year.

Our fellowship activities include informal small group and large group social activities, Volunteer Appreciation Night in October, the President's Ball in the spring, curling and golf opportunities in both league and tournament format, and social interaction at our weekly meetings.

Community Service — Rotary Chinook supports CUPs, Samaritan's Purse, Salvation Army Kettles, Operation Eyesight, Capsule of Life, Rotary Employment of Disabled Persons Partnership, Food Bank, Super Kids, plus many other charities on a request basis. Special projects include Rotary Challenger Park, and the Chinook Rotary Nature Park.

International Service — We are currently involved in the following projects:

- ▶ In the Dominican Republic, provision of latrines, water filters, and light emitting diodes (LED project), plus a reforestation project.
- ▶ In the Philippines, a garden project for vocational training of students.
- ▶ In Lebanon, a rehabilitation program for females on the streets.

Other special Rotary Programs include the Rotary Foundation, Ambassadorial Scholarship Program, Group Study Exchange and Group Travel Exchange.

Vocational Service — Opportunities exist for exchange of ideas among the various vocations as represented through our membership: workplace visit exchanges, High School mock interviews, and Club program presentations.
